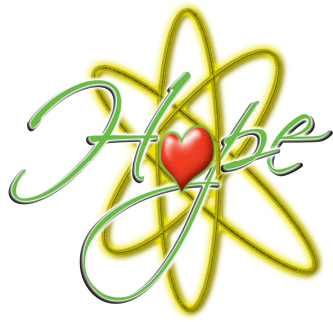

Care Group Meets Weekly

To reach out to hurting people and people in need, Hope Fellowship provides a weekly Care Group on Tuesdays at 7 p.m. Reverend Allen Weiser leads the Care Group in prayer and discussion on topics like ‘How to Overcome Discouragement’ and ‘Overcoming Fear, Doubt & Worry’.

Free student workbook material is provided each week from Training for Life Ministries - The Helping Series by Robert J. Kurz. This

series is available through Hope Fellowship and equips participants with the knowledge to overcome life’s difficulties and problems in a healthy biblical way.

Each week the group watches a DVD seminar on one of life’s challenges, followed by a time of sharing, group discussion, and counseling. Homework is assigned to each person, which challenges them to personal accountability and accepting biblical instruction for their own lives.

The group has learned to personalize scriptures like Philippians 4:11 “...I have learned in whatever state I am, to be content.”

The Care Group has been able to provide encouragement to recently divorced people of all ages, religions, and backgrounds.

The Care Group is free and open to the public. It has enabled hurting people to form friendships and to begin a healing process through the Word of God.

Bible Studies Search For Truth

Searching for truth through the scriptures with others has given Reverend Allen Weiser an opportunity to share his Bible knowledge. For many people, a study in the home is preferred over a traditional church service. This gives people a chance to ask questions and search the

scriptures for themselves. During the bible studies, prayer requests are taken and time is spent praying for each request.

Hope Fellowship has bible studies written in English, Chinese, Russian and Spanish. No matter how much time a person may have, there is a

bible study available to fit their needs. Into His Marvelous Light is a one hour bible study that has been taught numerous times as a university campus outreach. There is also a 12-week study that teaches basic bible knowledge from Genesis to Revelations, the beginning to the end.

2,000 Prayer Guides Given at Halloween

During Trick or Treat on MainStreet, Hope Fellowship distributed 2,000 prayer guides to Los Alamos residents. Thousands of people from Los Alamos County and the surrounding areas flock to the downtown area dressed in costumes to get candy and company give aways. Los Alamos Chamber of Commerce members set up tables and give away thousands of pieces of candy and advertisements. This October, Hope Fellowship

wanted to give something to the community that would last a life time, Family Prayer Guides. The prayer guides were aimed at children, youth and parents. One of the prayer guides was ‘Kingdom Praying - Scripture Praying for Kids’. It teaches young people how to pray for their family, friends, their neighborhood, the sick, the world and even for themselves. Parents were happy to receive the prayer guides and several people asked for more.

Hundreds of bottles of bubbles are handed out to children and adults, as well

as, prizes to hula-hoop contest winners. The Los Alamos Monitor has featured Hope Fellowship on their front page with the Unbelievable Bubble Wand, a community favorite each year.

cones and handing the stacks to them. Volunteers have a chance to see the parade first hand and enjoy the festivities after the last float has gone by.

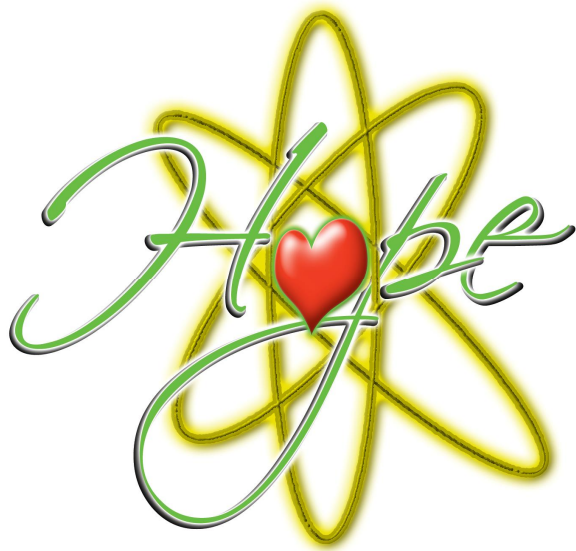
